



Persistent organic pollutants Statement

POPs (persistent organic pollutants), such as pesticides and some industry chemicals, which can be transported across international boundaries far from their sources. They persist in the environment, bioaccumulate through the food web, pose a risk to human health and the environment. The continuous release of POPs into the environment has been seriously concerned by **European Union since Regulation (EC) No 850/2004** of the European Parliament and of the Council on POPs entered into force in 2004. After several amendments, the POPs regulation was recast into **Regulation (EU) 2019/1021** of the European Parliament and of the Council in 2019, and it was most recently amended by **Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2023/1908** of 30 May 2023.

Bel Fuse Inc. has evaluated all the information provided by our suppliers. As of this date, and to the best of our knowledge and belief, our products do not contain any chemicals from the List of substances subject to POPs Regulation (last updated **18 November 2025**) or in the **Proposals for listing chemicals in the Stockholm Convention on POPs** (last updated **05 January 2026**)

We will continue to conduct surveys with our suppliers on a regular basis. Should we discover that POPs exist within our supply chain, Bel Fuse Inc. will notify the affected parties and will take necessary actions to deliver **POPs-free** products.
